



Copyrighted font files have been detected on your website. You should check the copyright details for each font to ensure no licenses are required.

For each font listed, you should be confident that you either hold a license for these fonts, or that the fonts have been legitimately purchased through a third-party who has the rights to sell these fonts to you (for example, some website themes or plugins may come loaded with commercial fonts).

You should read the font licenses for commercial fonts purchased to ensure you are permitted to use them for web (most fonts have specific licenses for this), and for commercial purposes if required (free fonts often do not allow fonts to be used for commercial purposes without paying for a license).
